
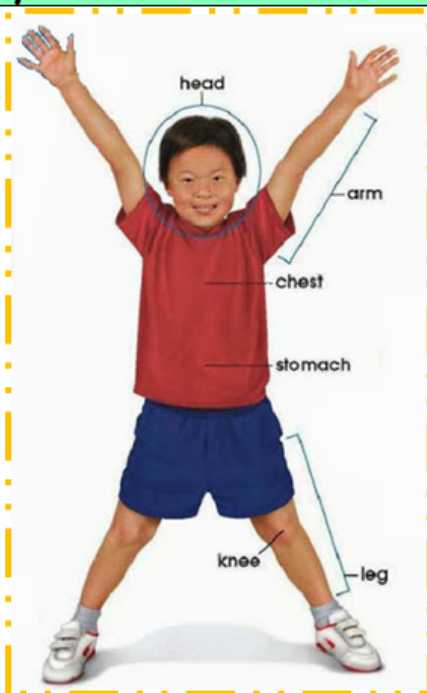


Animals Including Humans Knowledge Organiser – Year 1: Term 2

Senses Vocabulary		
sight	You see with your eyes. They let you see all the things around you.	
hearing	You hear with your ears. They let you listen to all the things around you.	
touch	You touch with your skin. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough by touching it.	
taste	You taste with your tongue. You might have some tastes that you like and some that you do not.	
smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.	

Body Parts Vocabulary	
head	Your head is at the top of your body. It has two eyes, two ears, a nose and a mouth.
arm	We have two arms . Our arms are connected to our shoulders at the top and they have hands at the bottom.
chest	Our chest is the upper part of our middle. Our chest has a ribcage protecting our vital organs.
stomach	Our stomach is the lower part of our middle. It is where our food goes and it is squidgy.
knee	We have two knees that help our legs to bend.
leg	We have two legs that are connected to our hips at the top and our feet at the bottom.
