
It has been another positive week at Rosherville, with children working hard and taking pride in all that they do.

Attendance Matters

Coming to school every day really matters. Children who attend school regularly do better with their learning, feel happier, and make stronger friendships. Research shows that children with less than 7 days absence a year (attendance above 96%) are much more likely to achieve well by the end of primary school.

Missing just one day a week adds up to almost two months of learning lost over a year. This makes it harder for children to keep up and feel confident in class. By working together, we can help every child to feel settled, succeed in their learning, and be the best they can be.

The class with the best attendance this week is Zephaniah class with 98.7%, which is even higher than last week – Well done!

Mrs Basra is available on the gate each morning if you wish to speak to her about your child's attendance.


