Congratulations to both Morpurgo and Zephaniah classes who both had attendance of over 99% this week.



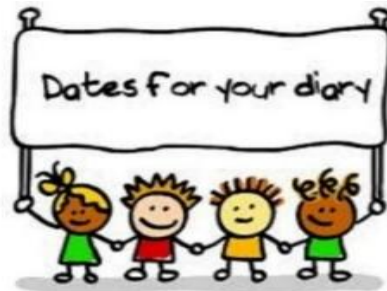
